





## WHAT DOES AN ADULT HIGH SCHOOL DO?

### *Provides opportunities for Nevada adults to:*

- Return to school and earn their GED or Adult High School Diploma
- Get a job
- Keep their job
- Get off welfare
- Transfer to college or other career and technical training programs
- Learn English language skills, understand US culture, and participate in society
- Help their children with homework and be successful in school
- Read and follow healthcare instructions

## PERFORMANCE RESULTS 2011-2012

### *Provides High School Diplomas and Certificates*

- 1,661 diplomas were awarded by Adult High School Programs in 2011-2012
- 1,842 learners passed the tests of General Education Development (GED)
- Over 28,000 high school credits were awarded to learners who were previously considered “non-graduates” or “drop-outs”.

### *Provides Education at a Low Cost*
